

RESOLUTION NO. _____ (N.C.S.)

A RESOLUTION OF THE SALINAS CITY COUNCIL ESTABLISHING 65 FEET OF “NO STOPPING” RED ZONES AT THE INTERSECTION OF NORTH MADEIRA AVENUE AND ROOSEVELT STREET

WHEREAS, the City received a request to evaluate the potential of establishing stop signs at the intersection of North Maderia and Roosevelt Street for all-way stop and sight lines; and

WHEREAS, stop signs are only warranted under specific roadway volumes or collision history. Staff found that stop sign warrants were not met at this location; and

WHEREAS, staff conducted an intersection sight distance analysis and is recommending the establishment of 65 feet of “No Stopping” red zones at the intersection of North Madeira Avenue and Roosevelt Street to provide sufficient intersection sight triangles; and

WHEREAS, on July 13, 2023, the Traffic and Transportation Commission meeting, the Traffic and Transportation Commission voted (4-1) to recommend to the City Council the approval of a Resolution establishing a total of 65 feet of “No Stopping” red zones at the intersection of North Madeira Avenue and Roosevelt Street; and

WHEREAS, the City of Salinas has determined that the implementing the parking restrictions is exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Guidelines (Section 15301, Class 1). The project consists of the operation, repair, or minor alteration of public streets involving no expansion of use. There would be no significant effect on the environment.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Salinas City Council hereby approved the establishment of 65 feet of “No Stopping” red zones at the intersection of North Madeira Avenue and Roosevelt Street.
