A RESOLUTION OF THE SALINAS CITY COUNCIL ESTABLISHING A TOTAL OF 55 FEET OF "NO STOPPING" RED ZONES AT THE INTERSECTION OF SWANER AVENUE AT SWANER CIRCLE AND 20 FEET OF "NO STOPPING' RED ZONES AT THE INTERSECTION OF QUAIL RUN CIRCLE AT ROSSI STREET.

WHEREAS, staff received request to evaluate the intersection of Swaner Avenue at Swaner Circle and Quail Run Circle at Rossi Street for sight lines; and

WHEREAS, staff conducted an intersection sight distance analysis and is recommending a total of 55 feet of "No Stopping" red zones at the intersection of Swaner Avenue and Swaner Circle to provide sufficient intersection sight triangles; and

WHEREAS, staff conducted an analysis for truck turnings and is recommending a total of 20 feet of "No Stopping" red zones at the intersection of Quail Run Circle at Rossi Street to provide the adequate space for truck turning into Quail Run Circle; and

WHEREAS, on March 10, 2022, the Traffic and Transportation Commission voted (6-0) to recommend to City Council the approval of establishing a total of 20 feet of "No Stopping" red zones at the intersection of Quail Run Circle at Rossi Street; and

WHEREAS, on July 14, 2022, the Traffic and Transportation Commission voted (6-0) to recommend to City Council the approval of establishing a total of 55 feet of "No Stopping" red zones at the intersection of Swaner Avenue and Swaner Circle; and

WHEREAS, the City of Salinas has determined that the implementing the parking restrictions is exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Guidelines (Section 15301, Class 1). The project consists of the operation, repair, or minor alteration of public streets involving no expansion of use. There would be no significant effect on the environment.
