SUBJECT: **2015 ADA PEDESTRIAN RAMPS AND STREET LIGHT IMPROVEMENTS
PROJECT NO. 9438**

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the City Council approve a resolution accepting the 2015 ADA Ramps and Street Light Improvements, Project No. 9438, for maintenance and responsibility.

DISCUSSION:

On July 7, 2015, Council awarded 2015 ADA Pedestrian Ramps and Street Light Improvements, Project No. 9438, to Norcal Contractor, for the amount of \$136,663.41. The project called for Norcal to construct new ADA compliant pedestrian access ramps and install new street lights to properly light the crosswalks for pedestrian safety at the following intersections: Crestview Street and Kittery Street; Granada Avenue and East Laurel Drive; Tapadero Street and East Laurel Drive; and Lamar Street and North Main Street. One Contract Change Order was issued in the amount of \$986.60 to balance in-place quantities, thereby bringing the total project contract amount to \$137,650.01, 0.7% over the award amount.

The project is now complete and the construction methods and materials met the project plan and specification requirements.

ISSUE:

Shall City Council approve a resolution accepting the 2015 ADA Ramps and Street Light Improvements, Project No. 9438, for maintenance and responsibility?

FISCAL IMPACT:

This project was funded with \$225,000.00 of Gas Tax funds. To date \$198,160.00 has been spent and encumbered on engineering, inspection, construction, and administration leaving an unencumbered balance of \$26,840.00

TIME CONSIDERATIONS:

The acceptance of this project will relieve Norcal Contractor of any further maintenance and responsibility.

ALTERNATIVES/IMPLICATIONS:

Council may choose to not accept this project. This is not recommended since this project was constructed in accordance with approved plans and specifications

CITY COUNCIL GOALS:

The 2015 ADA Pedestrian Access Ramp and Street Light Improvements Project addresses the current City Council Goals of Excellent Infrastructure; Safe, Livable Community; and Quality of Life.

CONCLUSIONS:

At its meeting on January 10, 2017, City Council is requested to approve a resolution accepting the 2015 ADA Pedestrian Access Ramp and Street Light Improvements, Project No. 9438 for maintenance and responsibility.
