TITLE: APPOINTMENTS TO THE SALINAS VALLEY GROUNDWATER
SUSTAINABILITY AGENCY BOARD OF DIRECTORS

RECOMMENDED MOTION:

A motion to approve a Resolution for the appointment of Brenda Granillo as the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) regulated water company representative, and Tom Adcock as alternate, to serve on the Salinas Valley Basin Groundwater Sustainability Agency (SVBGSA) Board of Directors JPA.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

In 2014, the California legislature adopted, and then-Governor Brown signed into law, three bills (SB 1168, AB 1739, and SB 1319) collectively referred to as the “Sustainable Groundwater Management Act” (SGMA). The stated purpose of SGMA is to provide for the sustainable management of groundwater basins at a local level by providing local groundwater agencies with the authority, and technical and financial assistance, necessary to sustainably manage groundwater. SGMA also required the designation of a Groundwater Sustainability Agency (GSA) for the purpose of achieving groundwater sustainability through the adoption and the implementation of Groundwater Sustainability Plans for all medium and high priority basins as designated by the California Department of Water Resources.

In accordance with the JPA Agreement and the governance model that was approved by the City Council on December 13, 2016, the City of Salinas has the responsibility for appointing a representative seat and an alternate to represent the City on the JPA Board. The JPA Agreement also designates the City as the appointing authority for a California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) regulated water company representative and alternate serving on the JPA Board. In June 2023, the City Council appointed Tom Adcock from Alisal Water corporation (ALCO) to serve as the primary and Brenda Granillo from the California Water Services Company (Cal Water) to serve as the alternate representative on the Board. The term for the CPUC regulated representative expires June 30, 2025.

DISCUSSION:

Representatives from Cal Water and ALCO have alternated serving the primary and alternate roles on the Board since the Board was formed in 2016. The only two CPUC-regulated water companies providing service in Salinas, only Cal Water and ALCO are eligible to serve on the Board. With the term expiring, Ms. Granillo and Mr. Adcock have agreed that Mrs. Granillo would succeed to the representative position on the Board and Mr. Adcock would succeed to the position of alternate. This succession, however, requires City Council approval through formal appointment of the representative and the alternate.

CEQA CONSIDERATION:

The proposed action is not subject to environmental review under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) [CEQA Guidelines Section 15378 and Section 15060(c)(2), (3)].

This topic aligns with the City Council's City Services goal by ensuring the city is represented in and working collaboratively on City/County-wide regional boards.
