**A RESOLUTION ACCEPTING THE 2025 PAVEMENT IMPROVEMENTS PROJECT,
CIP 9981 FOR MAINTENANCE AND RESPONSIBILITY**

WHEREAS, the 2025 Pavement Improvements Project, CIP 9981 (the “Project”) is a continuation of the City’s effort to maintain miscellaneous streets that have deteriorated in past years due to pavement age, vehicle usage, and type of vehicles on the roadway; and

WHEREAS, on June 25, 2024, pursuant to Resolution 23031, City Council approved the 5-Year Pavement Preservation Street List which prioritized pavement rehabilitation based on the Pavement Management and Street Selection Policy, Resolution No. 22953; and

WHEREAS, on June 17, 2025, pursuant to Resolution No. 23277, City Council awarded the Project to Granite Construction Company for the sum of \$4,853,080.20 and approved a 20% contingency in the amount \$967,766.00.; and

WHEREAS, the project began on September 8th, 2025, and included crack treatment, base repair, pavement patch and repair, pavement mill and fill, rubberized asphalt overlay and striping; and

WHEREAS, a total of nine street segments received pavement maintenance and an additional four small street segments were restriped; and

WHEREAS, a total of sixteen change orders totaling \$442,236.54 were issued along with seven additional working days for a total of 77 working days for the Project; and

WHEREAS, the total construction cost, including change orders, was \$5,295,316.74; and

WHEREAS, the project was funded through Measure X, SB1, and a grant from the California Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery (CalRecycle); and

WHEREAS, staff used the Project as an opportunity to combine resources to complete patch and repair needed to implement traffic calming measures and restriping. Staff is requesting a transfer of funds from Striping and Signage (CIP 9081) and Traffic Calming (CIP 9163) to reimburse the Project for the extra work requested; and

WHEREAS, the Project was deemed substantially complete on February 27, 2026; and

WHEREAS, the Project was determined to be exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Guidelines (Section 15301(c), Class I.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Salinas City Council accepts the 2025 Pavement Improvement Project, CIP 9981 for maintenance and responsibility; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Salinas City Council approves a transfer of \$69,351.97 from CIP 9081 to CIP 9981; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Salinas City Council approves a transfer of \$62,200 from CIP 9163 to CIP 9981.
