RESOLUTION NO. (N.C.S.)

A RESOLUTION OF THE SALINAS CITY COUNCIL APPROVING THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A TOTAL OF 110 FEET OF 20-MINUTE GREEN ZONES DESIGNATION AND 15 FEET OF "NO STOPPING" RED ZONE AT 259 WILLIAMS ROAD

WHEREAS, at its meeting of August 9, 2022, the Salinas City Council adopted a Resolution approving the 2022-2023 Special Curb Markings; and

WHEREAS, City staff received a request from Amer Abouzidan, the owner of Nopal Market of 259 Williams Rd, to install 20-minute green zones designation along the business' Williams Road and Fairhaven Street frontage; and

WHEREAS, staff conducted an intersection sight distance analysis and is recommending 15 feet of "No Stopping" red zone at the intersection of Williams Road and Fairhaven Street to provide sufficient intersection sight triangles; and

WHEREAS, on December 8, 2022, the Traffic and Transportation Commission voted (4-0) to recommend to Council to approve staff's recommendation of establishing 110 feet of 20minute green zones designation to allow for a quick turnaround of parking spaces for customers to have access to businesses and 15 feet of "No Stopping" red zone located at 259 Williams Road.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Salinas City Council hereby amends Resolution No. 22445 approved on August 8, 2022, by adding an additional 110 feet of 20-minute green zones designation at 259 Williams Road

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Salinas City approves the establishment of 15 feet of "No Stopping" red zone at the intersection of Williams Road and Fairhaven Street.
