



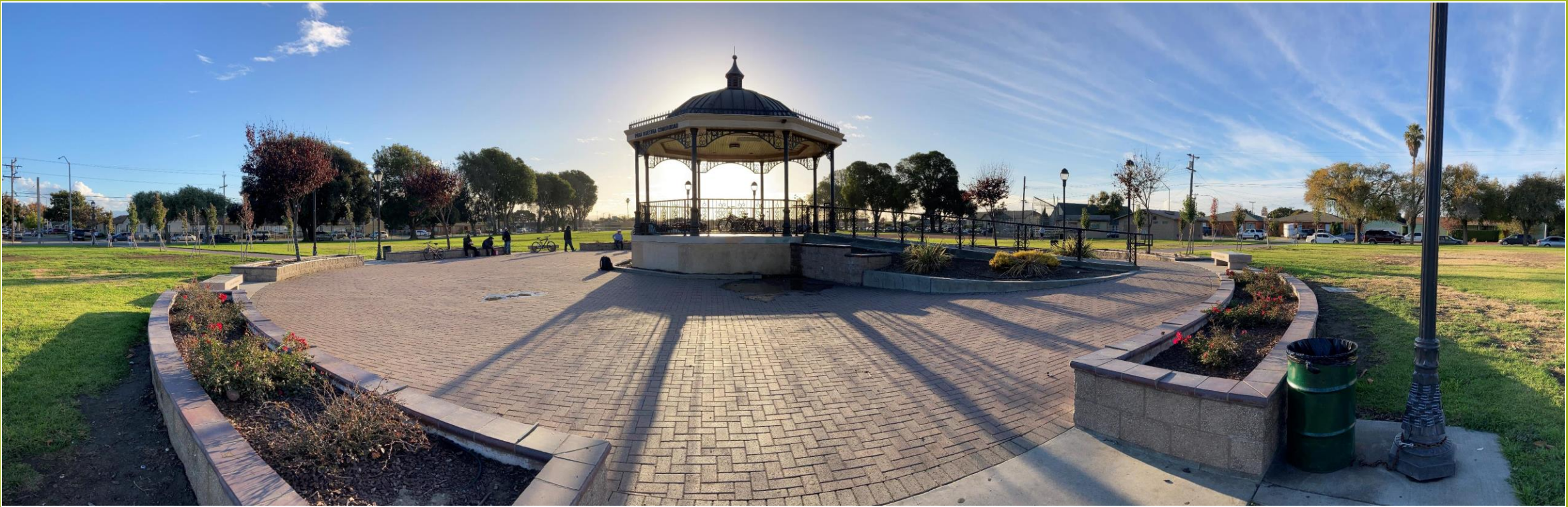

CLOSTER PARK IMPROVEMENT PROJECT \$6.8 MILLION GRANT AWARD

California State Parks Program Round 4

- \$548.3 Million Available
- Highly Competitive
 - Nearly 500 applications received, totaling \$2.43 billion dollars in project requests.
- Only 22% of applicants earned an award.

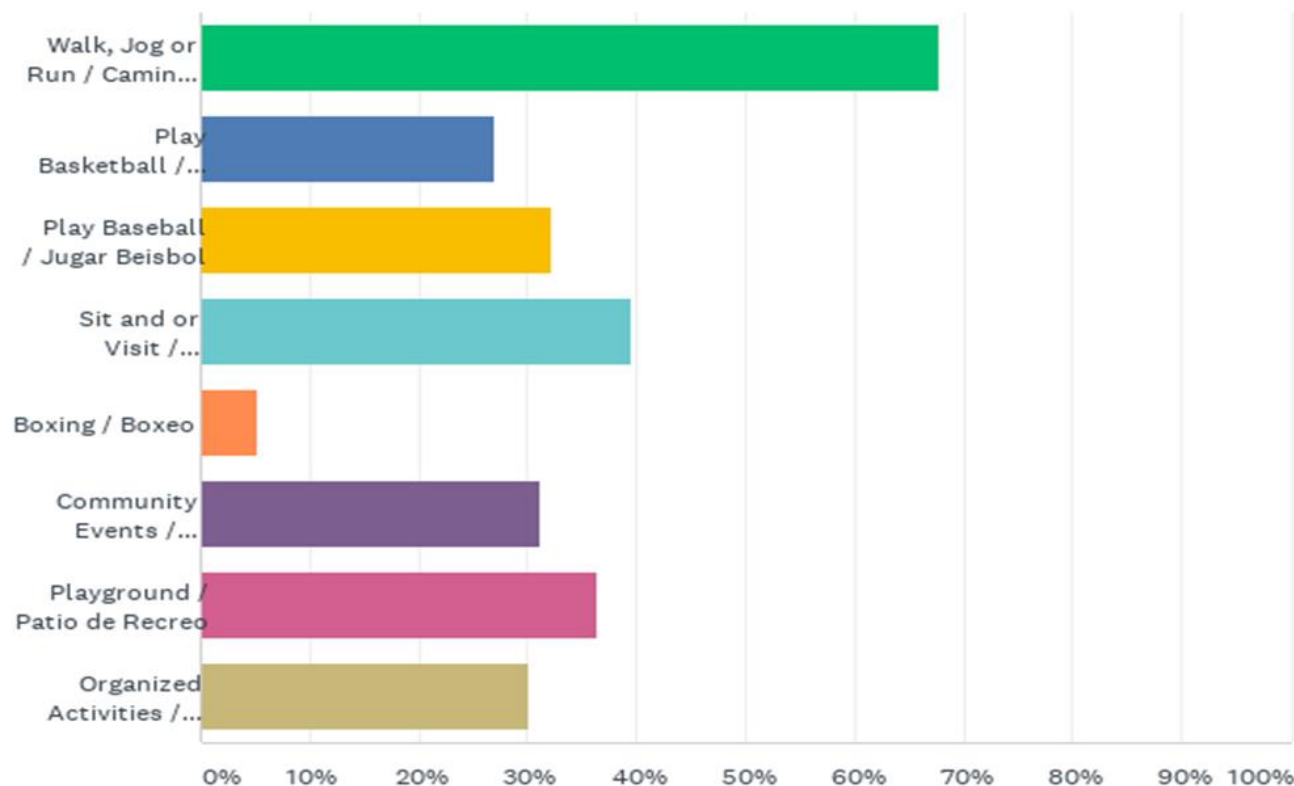


SURVEY DATA
