TITLE:MEMORANDA OF UNDERSTANDING FOR FIRE SUPERVISORS<br/>ASSOCIATION (FSA) AND ASSOCIATION OF<br/>MANAGEMENT PERSONNEL OF SALINAS (AMPS)

#### **<u>RECOMMENDED MOTION</u>**:

A motion authorizing the City Manager to sign the Memoranda of Understanding for the Fire Supervisors Association and the Association of Management Personnel of Salinas for three-year terms through December 31, 2019.

#### **RECOMMENDATION:**

It is recommended that the City Council approve a Resolution authorizing the City Manager to sign the Memoranda of Understanding for the Fire Supervisors Association and the Association of Management Personnel of Salinas for three-year terms through December 31, 2019.

#### EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

The City and employees of FSA and AMPS have been discussing a successor Memorandum of Understanding for each group since late 2016. The City's negotiating team recommends that the City Council approve the attached Memoranda of Understanding at this meeting.

#### BACKGROUND:

Highlights of the proposed changes to the FSA Memorandum of Understanding include the following:

- Term through December 2019
- A 2.5% cost of living salary increase for each year of the three-year agreement
- A \$2,000 one-time payment

- An incremental increase of 3% in the employee's contribution for CalPERS pension, leading to a total 12% increase from the current 9%
- Cost sharing language on health benefits that provides potential in future years for FSA members to contribute to health benefits, depending on the overall cost

Highlights of the proposed changes to the AMPS Memorandum of Understanding include the following:

- Term through December 2019
- A 2.5% salary increase for each year of the three-year agreement
- A \$2,500 one-time payment
- A reduction in bilingual pay for employees assigned after 1/1/2017
- Cost sharing language on health benefits that provides for AMPS members contributing to health benefits

#### CEQA CONSIDERATION:

**Not a Project**. The City of Salinas has determined that the proposed action is not a project as defined by the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) (CEQA Guidelines Section 15378). Because the matter does not cause a direct or foreseeable indirect physical change on or in the environment, this matter is not a project.

#### STRATEGIC PLAN INITIATIVE:

These Memoranda of Understanding assist the City in striving for the goal of an Effective, Sustainable Government.

#### FISCAL AND SUSTAINABILITY IMPACT:

The FSA agreement will cost a total of \$397,400 during the contract period. The AMPS agreement will cost \$1,282,200 and is included in the FY 2017-18 proposed budget. Taken together, the fiscal impact of these Memoranda of Understanding and all other employee MOUs approved by Council will require fiscal discipline and budget adjustments in the fiscal years ahead.
