WHEREAS, the City of Salinas (hereinafter "City"), as lead agency under the California Environmental Quality Act (Pub. Res. Act Section 21000 et seq.) and the State CEQA Guidelines (14 Cal. Code Regs. Section 15000 et seq.) (collectively "CEQA") has completed the Final Program Environmental Impact Report ("Final EIR") State Clearinghouse No. 2006021072 for the West Area Specific Plan in compliance with CEQA; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with Section 15082 of the CEQA Guidelines, on October 14, 2015, the City released a Notice of Preparation ("NOP") for the Draft Program Environmental Impact Report ("Draft EIR"), and received comments from nine (9) agencies and commenters in response to the NOP (these comments are included in Appendix A of the Draft EIR, herein incorporated by reference as Exhibit B); and

WHEREAS, an EIR public scoping meeting was duly noticed and held on October 29, 2015, to solicit public and agency comments on the scope of the Draft EIR; and

WHEREAS, the Draft EIR and associated technical appendices to the Draft EIR, herein incorporated by reference as Exhibits B and C, were prepared and the City filed a Notice of Completion of the Draft EIR, herein incorporated by reference as Exhibit D, with the California Office of Planning and Research State Clearinghouse on February 27, 2019, which commenced a 45-day state public agency review period ending on April 15, 2019; and

WHEREAS, the City filed a Notice of Availability of the Draft EIR with the Monterey County Clerk on February 27, 2019, which commenced a 45-day local public review period ending on April 15, 2019; and

WHEREAS, the Notice of Availability was also posted at the City of Salinas City Hall, the Salinas Permit Center, the City's two (2) libraries, and on the City's website; and

WHEREAS, the City, in accordance with CEQA Guidelines Section 15088, considered and evaluated ten comments received on the Draft EIR from members of the public, private organizations, and public agencies; and

WHEREAS, the City subsequently prepared a Final EIR, herein incorporated by reference as Exhibit E, which contains the comment letters and written responses to comments addressing the substantive environmental issues received; and

WHEREAS, the City prepared a record of modifications to the Draft EIR made in response to these comments; and

WHEREAS, the complete Final EIR consists of the Draft EIR, comments received on the Draft EIR; written responses to comments that addressed substantive environmental issues; a record of modifications made to the Draft EIR made in response to the substantive comments; appendices to the Draft and Final EIRs; and all documents and resources referenced and incorporated by reference in the Final EIR; and

WHEREAS, on December 4, 2019 the Planning Commission held a duly noticed public hearing to consider the Final EIR (ER 2018-003); the proposed West Area Specific Plan (SPEC 2013-002); Rezone (RZ 2019-001); and the proposed Development Agreement (DA 2019-001); and

WHEREAS, the Planning Commission weighed the evidence presented at said public hearing, including the staff report which is on file at the Community Development Department, together with the record of environmental review including the Draft EIR, public comments on said document and responses thereto, the Final EIR, and evidence and public testimony presented at the public hearing; and

WHEREAS, the Planning Commission reviewed and considered all of the extensive information contained therein prior to making recommendations to the City Council; and

WHEREAS, CEQA Findings have been prepared for the Project that are incorporated herein as Exhibit F regarding the environmental review process and the contents of the West Area Specific Plan Final EIR; and

WHEREAS, these findings, consistent with Public Resources Code section 20181, subdivision (a), address the significant environmental impacts of the Project, the mitigation measures for those impacts identified in the Final EIR and adopted as conditions of approval, and the feasibility of alternatives and the reasons why such alternatives to the Project were not approved; and

WHEREAS, Pursuant to CEQA, a Statement of Overriding Considerations, herein incorporated by reference as Exhibit F, has been prepared for the Project; and

WHEREAS, this Statement of Overriding Considerations, consistent with consistent with Public Resources Code section 20181, subdivision (b), identifies benefits of the Project that

outweigh its significant unavoidable environmental impacts, therefore justifying approval of the Project despite the impacts; and

WHEREAS, the Planning Commission has independently reviewed and considered the CEQA Findings and the Statement of Overriding Considerations required for the adoption of the Project; and

WHEREAS, the Planning Commission has independently reviewed and considered a Mitigation Monitoring and Reporting Program, herein incorporated by reference as Exhibit G; and

WHEREAS, this Mitigation Monitoring and Reporting Program, consistent with consistent with Public Resources Code section 20181.6, subdivision (a)(1), incorporates the mitigation measures identified in the Final EIR and provides mechanisms for making them enforceable; and

WHEREAS, certain mitigation measures identified in the City's 2002 General Plan Final Program EIR and in the City's 2007 Final Supplement for the General Plan Final Program EIR are still valid and applicable and are herein incorporated by reference; and

WHEREAS, notice of time and place of hearing for recommending certification of the Final EIR and recommending approval of the Project to the City Council was given in the manner prescribed by the City; and

WHEREAS, the Planning Commission has weighed the evidence presented at the public hearing, including the staff report which is on file at the City of Salinas Community Development Department, together with the record of environmental review.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Salinas Planning Commission hereby finds and determines the following:

- 1. The foregoing recitals and the information contained in the Exhibits are true and correct and are included herein by reference as findings.
- 2. The Final EIR has been completed in compliance with CEQA, the State CEQA Guidelines and local procedures adopted pursuant thereto.
- 3. The Planning Commission, consistent with Public Resources Code section 21082.1, has independently reviewed the Final EIR reports or declarations required and that the Final EIR reflects the City's independent judgment.
- 4. The Planning Commission has been provided with, reviewed and weighed the information contained in the Final EIR, the evidence in the record, the staff report and recommendations, and written and oral comments, and having done so, recommends that the City Council adopt the CEQA Findings and Statement of Overriding Considerations (incorporated herein by reference as Exhibit F), and based on those

findings, further recommends adoption of the Mitigation Monitoring and Reporting Program (incorporated herein by reference as Exhibit G).

PUBLIC HEARINGS

Chris Callihan, City Attorney, requested Commissioners publicly disclose any contact with project proponents, applicants or interested stake holders of the West Area Specific Plan before consideration of the item could commence: Commissioner Ottone reported contact with one of the applicants; however, not specifically about the West Area Specific Plan. No other commissioners provided disclosures.

Jill Miller, Senior Planner, and Steve McMurtry, Environmental Consultant, presented a PowerPoint presentation regarding the West Area Specific Plan; Final Environmental Impact Reports (ER 2018-003), Specific Plan (SPEC 2013-002), Rezone (RZ 2019-001), and Development Agreement (DA 2019-001). This presentation is on file at the Community Development Department.

Commissioner Meeks expressed concerns with Fire Department access due to the narrower streets, requested clarification about the Boronda Congestion Relief Project, and inquired about the number of additional police officers needed. Tara Hullinger, Planning Manager, indicated that collaboration with the Fire Department had occurred to ensure lane width complied with accessibility regulations. David Jacobs, Public Works Director, provided information on the Boronda Congestion Relief Project. Ms. Miller indicated that the plan would call for the hire of 17 police officers.

Commissioner Hernandez requested clarification on the plan designations for low, medium and high-density areas as well as the park designation space proposed in the project. Ms. Hullinger provided clarification. Mr. Hernandez also asked if the potential impacts to the Bolsa Knolls residences had been addressed that were expressed during the Planning Commission Study Session presentation. Ms. Hullinger indicated the concerns were addressed in the response letters and added that the requirement for connection to the sewer system is a requirement of the County of Monterey.

Commissioner Nohr expressed concerns with the development timeline for the plan as it relates to the inclusionary housing. Ms. Hullinger indicated that development will be market driven and will adhere to the City's inclusionary housing ordinance.

Commissioner Rocamora stated that the City has a parking problem in certain areas and asked how the future impact would be as a result of the higher density areas proposed in the plan. Ms. Hullinger indicated that the vision of the General Plan is to have more pedestrian-oriented residential areas as set forth in the Specific Plan.

Commissioner Ottone requested clarification on City's response to the comment letter from Land Watch advocating for reduced project land use alternatives. Ms. Hullinger stated that reduced project land use alternatives would be inconsistent with the planning efforts that have occurred. Mr. Ottone also inquired if the study to review school impacts could be revised to address additional costs not met by current impact fees and potentially increase the fees as necessary. Ms. Hullinger indicated that the City reports annually to school districts on

The Work Street Vacation Project and The Initial Study and Mitigated Negative Declaration for the Airport Lease Project located at 1341 Mercer Way are expected to be presented to the Planning Commission on December 18, 2019.
