Executive Summary

- Confirm unpaid nuisance abatement charges from 2018-2020 and have the Finance Director collect unpaid charges of \$458,864.31
- Charges resulting from non-compliant owners:
 - Building Division Building Violations/Work Without Permit
 - Code Enforcement Division Administrative Order Charges/ Blighted & Unsafe Properties
 - Fire Prevention Bureau Unsafe Buildings
 - Risk Management Board Up Cost Recovery

Background

In 2013, City Council Approved Adoption of Section 1-49 (recodified as 1-05.39) of the Salinas Municipal Code:

- Authorizes Special Assessment against real property where fines and fees remain outstanding
- Allows recovery of charges not paid within 90 days and/or challenged by a timely appeal

Discussion

Pursuant to the requirements of the ordinance:

- Property owners are provided adequate notice:
 - Multiple invoices (mailed to owner & tenant)
 - Unpaid charges letter for today's meeting (60 days prior mailed to owner)
 - Public notice letter for today's meeting (30 days prior mailed to owner)
 - Owners have the option to pay in full by 7/15/2021 avoiding the assessment
- Assessment increased from \$268,712 (205 prop.) to \$458,864 (243 prop.)
 - Resulting charges necessary to recoup fines/costs and deter owners from allowing properties to fall into disrepair or blighted condition again

CEQA Consideration

• The City of Salinas has determined that the proposed action is **not a project** as defined by the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) (CEQA Guidelines Section 15378).

Strategic Plan Initiative

- Adoption of the proposed Resolution supports City Council's goals:
 - Operational Efficiencies Ensures penalties are imposed on non-compliant blighted or unsafe properties in order to compel compliance and through the collection of debt in connection with real property.

Fiscal Impact

- Upon approval of the Resolution:
 - Finance Director provides notice to the tax collector that the Special Assessment should be imposed against each property in the same manner as ordinary municipal taxes
- Adoption of the Resolution in a timely manner is essential to direct the Finance Director to assess the properties in July, and reimbursement will facilitate the closure of the cases.

Recommendation

• Adopt a resolution approving \$458,864.31 in charges for the 2021 Special Assessment within the City of Salinas, and direct the Finance Director to collect those charges from property owners.
